A Note From Your Pastor....

I attended our synod's annual Assembly at PennWest (formerly California University). We celebrated, among other things, the first woman to reach 50 years ordained in this synod, Pastor Caroline Mendis. Here's a little bit about our synod's time together and the theme for the event:

We each make thousands of decisions daily that impact, not just ourselves, but our families, congregations, and communities. It can be hard to hear God's whisper guiding us to faithful decisions and holy outcomes amid the noise of the world. St. Ignatius of Loyola gifted us with EXAMEN, a five-step method of reflection that invites God's presence in our daily lives and discernment.

Thanksgiving, Petition, Review, Response, Look Ahead

In the coming year, between this Assembly and the next, our synod will experience many changes and our leaders will be entrusted to follow God's will in making decisions... not the least of which will be the 2025 election of a new Bishop. This Assembly will teach the method of Examen so that we may build new skills, engage in sacred practice, and set out for the year ahead with confidence and clarity. Together, we will learn how to transform discernment from a merely theoretical concept to a lived reality that can profoundly shape our shared future.

As we look ahead to the next year in our congregation, these steps to discernment may help us too, both individually and as a community of faith. Even as our congregations are so outwardly focused serving the community, inward reflection is required. What are we doing well? Where have we fallen short? What can we improve on? Have we prayed for God's direction and perspective? How can we faithfully respond to the challenges before us and plan for the future?

The interim between called pastors is a good chance to pause and reflect on these questions. Some of the things I've been hearing in my visits is a chance to improve communications and a chance to put in place plans and procedures that are welcoming to new members unfamiliar with our church, not just those members who "know how things are done." Being intentional about saying who we are, what we do, and how we do it, is one of the best ways to show welcome and hospitality.

We'll look at our congregations' constitutions as well as the yoking agreement. We'll be improving our social media presence to better our public witness. We'll put into place concrete ways our congregation ministers to those who are homebound or currently inactive, and make sure all are aware of it. We'll be working as individual councils to foster relationships of compassion and trust among us as elected leadership and in the congregation.




FORSALE

Minutes of Council Meeting Thursday, June 13, 2024, 6 p.m.

The meeting was opened with Devotions and Prayer by Sally Measel. This was written by Rev. Dr. Alexander Y. Sumo, Pittsburgh Lutheran United Ministries (PLUM). Based on James 3:17 "The wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure, then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere." Rev. Sumo talks of making transitions during very difficult and uncertain times, but we need to pray about it and not make decisions too quickly but to discern God's calling. Then let go of security. We can't move forward in faith while holding on to the past. Let go and let God! May the Holy Spirit be our guide in the transitions we face in life.

Secretary's Report – Motion to accept was made by Chris and seconded by Carla.

Treasurer's Report:

Contributions by envelope and plate, as well as rental income, for MAY (three Sundays) totaled \$9,364.75, compared to the budgeted amount of \$8,848. Giving was \$516.75 MORE than needed to meet monthly budget. For the year, contributions and rental income total \$54,609, compared to our budgeted amount of \$46,452. Giving year-to-date is \$8,157 more than budgeted.

Our average weekly attendance for the three Sundays in MAY was 42.

Other:

\$50 in Glade Run account will be sent to them.

Two more checks came in for Lenten Denial which will be forwarded to cause sent previous money to. Flower Fund line will be cleared with payment of \$15 for Easter flowers delivery.

Old Business:

- <u>AV Computer Update</u> A 2021 bid from Spectrum Audio Productions was presented. Bill will get an updated bid plus an additional one. If we go with this, it will save us buying a new computer and solve the ongoing problems that keep happening in recording services.
- <u>Survey Update</u> We got three more surveys. Some are interested in a boat ride at Moraine. There are several choices that will be looked into, and a date chosen.
- <u>Audit Update</u> With the paperwork being done by the Call Committee almost concluded, now a date can be set to complete the audit, as it involves some of the same people.
- <u>Synod Convention</u> Pr. Erin could not solicit any lay delegates to attend at Cal U this year, but both she and her husband attended June 14 and 15. Bill asked about a zoom option which should be available. Pr. Erin is chairperson of the nominating committee for Synod. Sthela had agreed to be listed as a delegate on the ballot for attending the ELCA convention in AZ, in July, 2025. Sthela was elected.

New Business:

- <u>Call Committee MSP Presentation</u> The first part of tonight's meeting was Jessica Gasior and Thom Cipro reading through all the paperwork for the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) that the Call Committee has diligently been working on. St. Paul's Council approved it last night and Zion's Council accepted it this night with a motion to approve by Chris, seconded by Sally. Motion passed unanimously. The document will be sent to Pr. Peter Asplin at Synod next. We thank the members of the Call Committee for the time and effort they have spent on preparing this document in pursuit of our next call for a permanent full-time pastor.
- <u>Pastor John's Final Payments</u> The issue was identified and is being resolved.
- <u>Baptism and First Communion</u> Pr. Erin obtained books for Baptisms and First Communions.
- <u>Pastor Evans onboarding progress and discussion</u> Pr. Erin is working on red registry book that had not been updated in past five years. We went through list of funerals/deaths she provided. Pr. Peggy Suhr-Barkley's grand baby will be baptized at Zion in July.
 - o Pr. Erin said volunteers are needed from Zion during Horse Trading Days, July 18, 19, and 20 to give away cold bottles of water, lollipops, and stickers and help with crafts, chalk, bubbles. St. Paul will not be selling lunches but will have a spaghetti dinner the evening of Thursday, July 18.
 - o Pastor questioned there being addresses of shut-ins in the bulletins. We need an updated directory and then this will no longer be needed.
- <u>Missionary in Madagascar</u>, Pr. Kristen Engstom, is now available for us to support. Chris motioned we
 accept her as our missionary, Doug seconded, motion carried. Our previous missionary was no longer
 working there.
 - Other: Metal chairs in social hall, not ones on rack, are available. They can be taken (with a donation, if desired). Pr. Erin will ask at next Ministerial meeting if anyone can use them.

We discussed the possibility of needing to add two small or one larger air conditioning unit(s) in the social hall on wall paralleling the sidewalk.

Doug wants to get rid of the old printer in hall to Pastor's office. The puzzles need to go as well or at least be moved. Pr. Erin would really appreciate that hall being cleared.
